I wrote letters to the missionaries explaining what had happened and we got an issue of the Bulletin which was due right then and told about the work the missionaries were doing, etc. I worked on that during that part of the summer.

One afternoon when I was there Dr. McIntire came in and said, I we're going to have a seminary we'd better start immediately. So he and I went up to Allentown to see Dr. Laird. There we found several men who came among our trustees. They got together a marvellous list of original trustees of our new seminary including ministers of big fine churches, and prominent Christian laymen. That's all they had yet. They had me, and they had a wonderful list of trustees. Francis Schaeffer had during the previous year been talking with me quite a bit. He was a second year student and he had become more and more disenchanted with the way things were going there. So we -- they decided on a name which I didn't particularly like, but we decided on that name. The question now was where to meet.
