Dr. McIntire put an ad, a big ad in the Christian Beacon, which he had had for about a year then naming all the trustees and telling about the foundation of the new seminary that would stand absolutely for the Word of God and be premillennial and asking for a place to meet. There was a Christian layman from Dr. Laird's church who got in touch with us right away and told us about a school in West Chester that had been closed and he wished we could get that property. We went down and met him and went and looked at the property. We did not have any money to buy any property with, and it was not quite easily accessible to us. We looked at different things, and Dr. McIntire said, My church building in Collingswood, if you could meet there we've got classrooms, etc. It was a lovely church building. He said that would be ideal, but he said, right now presbytery is bringing suit to try to take the building away from us and he said, I don't think we should complicate the matter and also it would cast a shadow on the future of the seminary if we lost the building. So Dr. Laird said, Why don't you meet in our new property? It's not much of a property. But they had an auditorium that would seat maybe 250-300. And there were S.S. rooms. Why don't you meet there? for the time being. So we decided to do that. Then the question was, Where would our students live? So Francis Schaeffer went down and looked around, And on the street on 14th street right above where the church building was,-- the church was at 14th and DuPont, and this was 2 or 3 blocks above that, he found 3 houses for rent. And people said, they did not remember member in years anytime there had been any house ~~for~~ for rent in that area. We got those buildings which gave us space for dormitory
