

and space for married students and for one ~~xx~~ or two professors. Just a block or so from where the seminary would meet. We felt there was a ~~xx~~ marvellous evidence of God's provision for us. In providing these fine trustees, in giving us a place to meet which was adequate. And we had 5 men who would be seniors at Westminster who wanted to come to study. Those 5 included Francis Schaeffer, Douglas Young, and his brother. His ~~bro~~ brother is now a professor at Covenant College, and has been a missionary and done a very fine work. So we had an excellent beginning of a student body. Though I dreamed one night that Oct. 1 came, the time to open and those 5 were --- I guess there were only 3 as yet and they were the only students we had. But when time came to start in the fall we had 25 students!

So proportionately compared with the number that came to Westminster from Princeton, 8 years before, we had a larger percentage even tho a smaller group. We felt the Lord gave such marvellous signs of his blessing upon it. We felt very happy about its start and I must say that for 34 years I conducted the seminary just about as I thought a seminary should be. Over and over in those years my mind goes back ~~to~~ those experiences at Westminster of holding up these men as the ideals of the great champions of the faith and we must do exactly what they say. That's the truth what they say. Over and over I said to the students, Don't you follow me; follow the Lord. If you follow me you get the habit of following a man, and the next man when I'm gone maybe would not be good to follow. I may lead you astray anyway. I'm only a man. Follow the Lord." That was our constant stress at the seminary during those years. Our big stress as here was on the Bible. Get into the Bible in the original and see exactly what it means. Stand on that. The Lord marvellously ~~b~~lessed. I believe it was the next year or year after they had one American fellow--- one
