Now, he said, If a man feels that way about the B.P.Church we ought not to keep him.

I think if we had not been meeting about the other thing, I think Dr. McIntire would have joined right with him and would have made them drop Dr. Saville. After all this he was tired. Armes talked about it; nobody paid attention and it was dropped.

It struck me so funny. As I understood it, Dr. Saville said, What do I have to do to under this action? Does this mean I must join the B.P. Church or merely not get out of it.
