He said, I don't stay usually more than 3 yrs. in a place. I've been here 4 yrs. That was a blow. I know a lot of fine things about the man, so I'm not giving his name. Jack went in there and he told me-- he had Caswell. Caswell had graduated from Faith, I think. W Jack had given him his first job as sexton at Church of the Open Door. He sort of represented Jack on the grounds up there. Jack said he came on the place and there were so many faculty members and students who wanted to see him about it that he had to meet Caswell outside!

A lot of the faculty people thought Caswell was beyond his depth there, in exerting authority. Jack did a lot of good for Shelton. I believe his leaving Shelton was due to his having arranged a big rally there for young people at which Charlie Woodbridge was to speak. McIntire heard of it, and told him he must cancel it. Must not have Charlie Woodbridge who was connected with Jack Wyrtzen. Not sure whether he was connected with Fuller or not. Anyway Jack felt so bad about being compelled to stop that that he decided he wanted to get into evangelistic work.

You asked about his particular connection with Faith. He used to come in and teach various courses at different times. I don't know whether he was -- he was never a full time member of the faculty but he -- I think he was on the board for a time. Not sure. There came a time when Jack and some other fine people were scheduled to receive D.D.'s from Immanuel College in Wheeling, W.Va. which was giving degrees to everybody at random. I don't think the college even exists anymore. I felt that was not good. I suggested on our board we give k them honorary degrees so they could have them from Faith instead of that. So we gave Jack the D.D. at that time. ((Immanuel gave him one too)).

Then after Jack left there Dr. McIntire was very put out about his leaving. I think he had a real grudge against him. The man who succeeded him was Clyde Kennedy from Glendale. In '62 Clyde developed a brain**zzozner** tumor. Had a big operation. Never recovered. Was months in bed, then died. I went to the funeral in Collingswood. Very impressive funeral. Carl presided and referred to different people.

Jack came and sat up in the fallery with some of his people and McIntire never referred to him at all. My wife felt that was very mean. Jack was so devoted to everything McIntire stood for, and so was Buswell at the time. So was Francis Schaeffer. His losing those people was very sad. Nowyou will notice that if refers to me in the Beacon he will say we have gone into this emx seminary with Jack Murray, and Jack, Ithink feels it much more than I do. I believe he does. You might say he would because he followed him much more closely than I did. I was quite free in the control of the seminary and he interferred with us hardly at all except to complain that our graduates were not all Bible Presbyterians. But I think the method we used got many more than would have been gotten by any other method.

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
