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I got him to give support for it to some extent but it was a little difficult to get it. Then there was a man in a little church of German background near there—near St. Louis, who got quite a burden for work in Europe 3 or 4 yrs. after the war. He wanted the Independent Board to send him there as a missionary. He was a real nice fellow but (not)—and particularly able. They were talking one day in the board, and I said I don't we ought to send him over there. I said, If it was somebody like F. Schaeffer he could do a real work there. They decided to send Francis over for a summer to investigate the possibilities for a missionary work.

Francis went over and went all over Europe getting in touch with people who were strongly against modernism. The result was the ICCC was formed. Then with the ICCC was formed, T. T. Shields was one of the big men in it and he got to the meeting I was told, Who is this fellow Schaeffer who is taking such a part in everything? He was kind of down on him. And other people got the idea Schaeffer wanted to be prime president of it. Well, as a missionary there working mostly with children for Christ work, he could not fill a big organization like that. He wasn't in position to. So they elected McIntire but he had the feeling Schaeffer was trying to be the head of it. Dr. Holdcroft said he didn't think Schaeffer had been treated right in that situation.

Schaeffer was secretary of the IVCC and very active in it for several years. There was another cause of division. How those things do come. I was not at the first meeting. I was at every meeting of the ICCC up till I left Faith. They asked all who hadbeen at all the meetings (it used to happen every 3 or 4 xexx yrs.) to stand. People were amazed I did not stand. But I was not at the first meeting because in '47 they were quite suspicious of me after Fuller had announced that I was invited there. So in '48 when they went to Holland to start the ICCC they did not suggest that I go to it.

I missed the first one, but I was at all subsequent ones. In fact I guess I was on the program of all subsequent meetings. Then Schaeffer went over there and got these connections. Then he left his church in St. Louis and went over there to start work of Children for Christ in Europe, and went to Switzerland and made a headquaters and travelled around and he did a nice little work for a few years. Then eventually he blossomed out into this student work. Sort of by accident you might say because he was working wherever the opportunity lay.

The opprotunities came particularly well in this direction. He worked into it and did a tremendous work. Life is a strange thing how at things develop so differently from what a person expects so often. The Lord has marvellously used both Dr. Murray and Dr. Schaeffer. Different types of work in many ways but both standing for the gospel, for the Lord and both having done
