

the highest salary now of anybody in the movement! I don't know what he was getting. He was getting a comfortable (amount) from a lot of different sources. He had a lot of connections. He has certainly worked as hard as anyone I ever knew in my life.

His attitude was to say, You should come, etc. I went over and put a good face on and we went ahead with commencement that night. That was the only time in all the years that I had an experience like that with him. I was pretty upset about that. That was '69. Now a year or two (not sure whether it was in '69 or '68) that we got a student named Kenneth Lee. If it had not been for this man Kenneth Lee I'd still be at Faith. He was the force that precipitated things.

Lee was trained as a lawyer and had been with some branch of the armed services for a while. Older than most of the students. But singularly lacking in sense. Now he and McIntire have completely broken. But he told somebody he came as a missionary to Faith Seminary. He wanted to straighten out things at Faith. He did not say anything to me. I did not have any idea for a year or two after he was there. He was working among the students, and he got a large group of students and they were following him in taking a stand that you have got to be just exactly so on all these things. In your strong stand against communism and against anybody who has anything to do with any denomination that is connected with the WCC\*

I don't know what all his points were, but it was his attitude which was very unpleasant. But he did not show it much for a year or two. I did not realize he was that way at all. But he was getting these students -- at one time he had quite a large group of students who were following him pretty much. Then some of them got their eyes open, and it got smaller. The last year he had a group of about 15 students who were just about 100% with him.

To show you how closely there were with him: There was a student body meeting in which they were going to do something that he disapproved of. They got into the meeting and they found they did not have the votes, so he told his-- he and his followers all walked out of the meeting so there would not be a quorum there so they could not do anything. He was quite a character.

There was another thing that came up. In Florida Dr. McIntire had purchased the Cape Canaveral property. He decided he would like to build a full-size replica of the Jerusalem Temple. He got DDr. Cohen all excited about it. DDr. Cohen was going to direct the planning of it, etc. The last year I was there I got a phone call-- I was off near Chambersburg. I phoned home and my wife said it had been announced over the radio that Dr. Cohen this spring, immediately starting the end of January, DDr. Cohen was going to be in Florida building up this museum.

I phoned Cohen from there and talked to him at length. I said, Look here, you are a member of our faculty. You've taught one semester and the next semester is coming.
