We had a fellow once who tried to --got out a notice that there were a lot of Baptist students at Faith. He wanted to organize the Baptist students at Faith. I talked to him against it. You organize a Baptist group, then you'll have a Bible Presbyterian group, different groups. We don't want that we sort of thing. He actually became a presbyterian when he left. I talked him out of that.

Randy Pond the first year student, took the position of leader-ship in this. I told him we had the ICY which was part of the ICCC. They had a meeting of ICY and Lee went there with agroup of his supporters and they moved an election of officers and elected either him or Pond as president of the local group and changed the thing all around. Of course I didn't recognize that. We stopped that.

Toward the end of the semester I told Lee he'd have to get out of the building. We would not have him staying in the building. He said == I said, You can get notes from somebody else. He said, You know I'll appeal this above you. I forget some of the details. In the end that action was taken by the Board.

Three fourths of the students had signed a petition in which they quoted from the thing I had writtenin the catalog about the thing the seminary originally stood for. They quoted it and said how they would like the seminary to be this way and how they disapproved of the attitude of this little & group that was making the trouble. The Board received the petition and cut out the last half and approved of the first half - that they stood behind the purpose of the seminary, as I had originally stated.

At commencement they announced how I was retiring and everything. I gave them a talk and read these things from the constitution and said if anyone wants to start an organization that will be advancing these ideals I will be glad to give it any hell I can toward it. I don't think McIntire & understood the implications of that because he said, Let's give a dinner for Dr. MacRae. Let's give a big dinner for him. I said, Don't do that. I am working on my books and don't want to take time for that. He told what a wonderful spirit I had.

It really was funny. Let me tell you a funny thing that happened. One of these fellows with Lee presented a paper critisizing us pretty strongly. There was another fellow who later became one of their faculty members who presented a paper saying he had noticed in the library they had the 6th and 7th books of Moses, and those are magical books. And you read in Ephesians((Acts)) how they burned the evil books and we should not have them in the library. They just laughed about it. After all we have books on all kinds of cults and that does not mean we support them at all.

So that night(at commencement) there was a man(a graduate) who had been hit by a car and they said he would only be a vegetable. But he had recovered to a very large extent and was there in a wheel chair and he asked if he could say a few words. McIntire said, Suppose we let him say a few words. So he got up and said how they had said he would only be a vegetable and how fine he was now, gave a nice talk. Then he went on and on add
