the. I will make thee a new sharp threshing instrument." The deliverance that God is going to give to His people. He is going to bring them safely out, and bring them safely across the great wilderness, and bring them back, and Hz get you go on to v.20 and 21, and you/to the omniscience of God. How do you know these great things are going to happen? Well, God proves it by His omniscience. They are done that Eng they may see and know and understadn together that the hand of the Lord has done it, and the Holy One of Israel has created it.

Now, we want to look on at the **XXXXXX** rest of this chapter, and then the great added material about the servant of the Lord in 42 with the seeming contrast, like almost a conflict between the beginning of 42, and the end of 42, to which begin to Bring out the problems/which we find an answer only when we get to 53. We will adjourn now for 8π minutes.

We start right in with the theme of the servant. "Behold my servant." I uphold, my elect, in whom my sould delights. I have put my spirit upon Him, he shall brng forth judgment to the gentiles." This is just wat what we expect. Abraham was told, in thee shall all nations of the earth be blessed. Abraham is called, the one whom God has called and chosen, not simply because He Lydes Abraham, but because He wants $\dots 6\frac{1}{4}$ He is the **intr** instruemnt for the Lord. He is His servant. What is the great work God wants done? It is the work of bringing judgment to the Gentiles. It is the work of bringing deliverance from sin to all the nations of the earth. This is work of bringing God's message, God's judgment to the Gentiles. All right, he will bring forth judgment to the Gentiles. How is he going to do this? Is he going to run around and see, Oh, come quickly, let's get basy here, what we are going to do? No. "He shall not cry, nor lift up, nor cause his voice to be heard in the street." In stath other words, he is one who has so much power, that he doesn't need to be all flustered in what he is doing. He can do it with7... with steadiness, with calmness. He marches forward majestically in the doing of His work. The servant of God is going to accomplish His work. Well, it doesn't sound tike the Jews, we won't cry, nor lift up our voice to

100
