is a Christian -- only God knows.

But that is not the only reason that I gave this message this morning. I think that it is vital that we who have been saved go back constantly to first principals. I think that it is vital that we go back constantly to see the pit from which we have been delivered and to see what Jesus Christ did for us on Calvary's cross. I think that it is vital that we stress it over and over again and that we go back constantly to remind ourselves of what we owe to the Lord Jesus Christ.

But that is not all. I think that this message is necessary and vital for Christians—for everyone of us, and for myself as much as anyone else—it is needed for us every day. I think that it is vital that we remember we cannot lie down in sin, even though we have been saved. Shall I sin that grace may abound—God forbid. It is God's will that the saved Christian will have a constant realization of the terrible nature of sin and shall be praying to God from day to day that He might give Him a greater liberty from it and greater freedom through the gift of God which is eternal through Jesus Christ our Lord.
