The Bible, and Torrey's <u>How To Lead Men To Christ</u>. And I studied those two books for two months, and <u>km</u> in my early days that was what I preached. But then I read some books on the higher criticism and I saw that my ideas had been wrong, and I changed them." And he had been a Methodist preacher in Australia, and he <u>m</u> was put out of the Methodist church, where he was preaching, there, and came to this country and **beganxaxgreat** became a great Congregational preacher in this country.

But he said to me, "When the man was converted who became the great missionary to Africa, who had such tremendous influence there, I was preaching the most old-fashioned type of an orthodox gospel you can think of, and belieting every word of it. When the man was converted who went into the Australian parliament and became a great worker for the improvement of scial conditions, I was preaching exactly the same gospel as when the other man was converted. But, he at that time my mind was filled with doubts, and I was wondering whether there was any truth to the words that I was saying."xEmixIx

I was x very interested. That this man who had been preaching, had been preaching for twenty or twenty-five years on social righteousness and improvement of human conditions when I thought that the two great accomplishments of his life were the reaching of these two men, and what he reached them with was the old-fashioned Gospel. And it is x the greatest force for social betterment, and the improvement of human characters. And when you **tix** liberate human character from the shcakles of Satan, and set them free to study the ethical principles of the Bible, and to attempt to applys them in their lives **x** and in their relationships to others, you have unleashed the greatest force for true social improvement that can possably be unleashed. **IXXWERTS**
