But, when they became numerous, that their voice would be kered heard, when they became powerful enough in the nation that they were a group that others would have to pay some attention to what they said, then I say it was their duty, to not as their primary duty, but yet a duty to speak out against moral iniquity, at such as that of the Communists. To speak out against such agression as that of the Communists. To speak out against such brutality as that of the Communists. And to speak out against such a menace to human freedom and human thought, as the Communist movement represents.

Now, I am sorry that I ran over a little, but I did want to round out the subject. I hope that Mr. Maris will forgive me if this takes five minutes off of his hour.
