The mark of the happy man which is given in our text is that he finds his greatest delight in the Word of God.

It is evident that many of us do not have this delight in God's Word. How, then may we secure it? The first way which can be given is to know the author. A girl once read a book which she considered rather tedious. Soon afterwards she met a young man and the two of them fell very much in love with each other. He happened to mention that he was the author of this book. That night she took it down from its shelf again - she read it now with a new interest. She could see the author all through it. If you know the author of the Bible, you will find that it has a new interest for you. The Bible is like a letter from God. It is a message from the Creator of all things, it is from the All Powerful, All Wise, Holy, Good, Omnipresent God. Do you know the author of the Bible?

How do you know God? Do you know Him as a great power somewhere far distant who has established the laws of the universe? Do you know Him as a great judge who is anxious to censor the details of your life, or do you know him as the Loving Father who is interested in the welfare of all of His children. If you know God as your Father, you will love His book, but God is not your Father unless you have been born of Him. If you have been born from above through the blood of Christ, then you have a divine nature. A new creation has been wrought in your being.
