Well, now, a wicked man can't even imagine such a thing. ~~He might be interested~~ <sup>Delighting</sup> in doing what is right finding pleasure in it, finding it to be really something that fills your life with happiness, but that is what the one must find who truly is saved through Christ, and is following Him. And I am sure everyone of us to quite an extent find our delight in the law of the Lord, but I think God wants us to meditate upon this, and find out if really is so in the law of the Lord, that ~~his~~ His book, His Word thrills us more than ~~ex anything~~ anything we can read in the newspapers, more than anything that is written to amuse and thrill people. We have a great deal in our day of trying to win people to the Lord with all kinds of interesting things put on to attract and interest people and all kinds of songs to make them feel happy, and bring their attention to the things of the Lord, and certainly any kind .....13.... that succeeds in winning people and drawing them is worthy of consideration, but if you stop with it it is worth nothing. If you really come to know the Lord, your delight far more than any of those things will surely....
