Now our time has gone rapidly, and I have only finished the second point, so I will only mention the third. The third is the accessibility of the river for relief of thirst. v.17, Rev. 22, Let him that is athirst come, and whosoever will, let him drink of the water of life freely. The river is available, it is accessible, we must point others to it. It is available, it is accessible. We must use the14.....ourselves. Study the means of reaching the lost. Study the means of developing the character God wants you to have. Study the means of carrying out in your life what God wants you to do, but remember the vital source is the river. We are interested in the fruit, but to get better fruit we water the roots, we don't water the fruit. The14½.....point from which all this must come is the river. Let him that is athirst come. Oh may God make us a thirst each one of us for this work, for more knowledge of what the cross of Christ means, for more knowledge of how to feed on Christ, and how to grow through Him, that we not be people who have just been dipped in the river and gone off somewhere, but that we stand beside the river and like a street (?) planted by the river, constantly drawing our nourishment from the river, staying there by it, feeding upon it, and growing thereby, and bringing forth our fruit in our season.
