who still lived about a block away from here. - he comes over and visits every once-in-a-while and he's amazed and thrilled at the way the place is being used - he came upstarts, according to this book, and said, "Mr. Widener, there's a man at the door who would like to see the art. He says his name is Sundby." So he brought him upstairs, Mr. Widener showed him through the art gallery and when he left Mr. Widener said, "I have bought a little guest book for the beople to sign that come to see my pictures. Would you like to sign it?" And he wrote in it, "W. A. Sundby - keep looking to Jesus". I think that was prophetic of the use to which this building would some day be put. So now we've been here 4 years in this building and there is not a theological seminary in America - in the world - that is better fitted with material equipment now than we are. All we have to do now is to pay for it - but we've made a real good start on that. But now there is a third element in the history of it that I must mention beyond that. First Satan took over Princeton Seminary and Princeton Seminary today, the Word of God is denied and modernism is taught in the most subtle way.

the taking of often fine, Godly young men and
filling their minds with unbelief. But that's true not merely at Princeton
Seminary, but at nearly all of the old line seminaries in American today
unfortunately. It's the ones that have gone most recently that are most
used of Satan because once a place has been modernist very long, it usually
loses its zeal and comes to have very few students and little income(?) but
it's the ones that have comparatively recently gone modernist, that Satan
uses to lead people of evangelical family and background to go and to get
their faith twisted and warped to the place where they're of little use in
God's service. But then we foundmak Westminster, and then Satan got people
off into a groove where they would put this fanatical emphasis on certain
