makeup of our souls, in the makeup of that which is not present to our consciousness.

Now, this is the great contribution which Sigmund Freud has made to modern medicine, to modern understanding, a contribution which is helpful to every one of us, no matter how much we may test some of the harmful things that Freud came to in his later years. He laid the foundation for the scientific recognition of this fact, that man is not just some bones and some muscles and some segments that you can examine and find everything that is there, and any result is caused by that, but that there is a mind, there is a continuing thought, there is something which has experiences. and which is deceitful, and needs to be dealt with. Well the Bible tells us the way to deal with them. And if we deal with it, from the very start to the end, the way the Bible says, we will probably never ..... $13\frac{1}{n}$ ..... of hitle type (?) of dealing with it, /xhexfack that Freud has worked out and his followers, but most of us have places along the way where we have sad results of our failing to follow the Lord, and these results has effects which can be dealt with, as we might deal with a broken leg.

And so I want to say a word to you this morning about how Freud found this, and about that which is so helpful for us to realize in what he found. Perhaps just a very brief word wbout an experience which Freud himself had. As a young man he studied medicine in the university. And one evening he came out between the marble xxxx columns of the university, and descended the stone steps, and was about to cross the great open square which lay glimmering in the dust, when suddenly he was seized with a strange giddiness, with his head swimming and his moist palms clenched, he made his way across and stood against the building until he recovered. And several times he had experienced this strange sensation, almost like terror which seized him unaccountably. Only when he became aware of open space around, and he found it difficult to travel, he would have this...end of record 1
