He said, It was the case of a sick girl, ill with hysteria, who cured herself by talking. And Freud said, What on earth do you mean, by talking. Why Brewer said, By talking out her troubles while she lay sleeping in a hypnotic spell. Freud asked him for more details, but Brewer was ~~too~~ too busy, and couldn't tell him about them, and quite a while went by before he was able to get a chance to hear anything about them. In the meantime he was trying to help patients with hypnotism, and other means, and helping some of them wonderfully, and others he couldn't ~~help~~ help at all. He'd give them lots of hot baths, and then he'd give them cold baths. He'd tell them to go climb mountains, do vigorous work, to get into a room alone, absolutely quiet without a sound, and he tried every possible method, and some things helped some people, and some people weren't helped at all. And then he saw Brewer again, and he asked Brewer, will you tell me about this case you had, a good many years ago.
