The fact that we have ternal life. All that makes life worthwhile is the result of his chastisement. What he did in order to accomplish XXX in order to bring to us. This word "chastisement" is MANNET moosar which means "discipline" 'struggle" "effort" "suffering". The proverb says seize on to moosar that which you struggle and suffer in order to accomplish. I often translate . Well in this connection it's what he went into for us, voluntarily underwent for us. "Chastisement" perhaps isn't such a good word in modern English becuse chastisement suggests a punishment given to a person in order to lead them to turn away from what is wrong. Of course that's not true about Jesus'
