mean the second interest at all. It simply means interest. So, I will give the modern word which is used. for it. - T ke therefore the talent from him, and give it unto him which hath ten talents. For unto every one that hat shall be given, and he shall have abundance: but from him that hath not shall be taken away even that which he hath. And cast ye the unprofitable servant into outer darkness: there shall be weeping and gnashing or teeth. "

Now there is another parable which has many similarities and also many dissimlarities from this one. So, we will, now look at Luke 19:verses 9 to 27. I am starting a little before the beginning of the parable, because I see the context is a little off. I am starting a little beffore the beginning of the parable because Ise I see that the context is often very important, whether the parable immediately follows what the Lord says said on the same occasion or not, at least the Holy Spirit has arranged in this way. It is possible in some occasions that he simply arranged in a certain way with no particular reason. But in many cases there is a reason...

So I am starting with verse 9: "And Jesus said unto him, This day is salvation come to this house, forsomuch as he also is a son of Abraham. For the Son of man is come to seek and to save that which was lost. And as they heard these things, he added and spake a parable, because he was night to Jerusalem, and because they thought that the kingdom of God should immediately appear. He said therefore, A certain nobleman went into a far country to receive for himself a kingdom, and to return. And he called his ten servants, and delivered them ten pounds, and said unto them, Occupy till I come. But his citizens hated him, and sent a message after him, saying, We will not have this man to reign over us. And it came to pass, that when he was returned, having received the kingdom, then he commanded these servants to be called unto him, to whom he had given the

money, that he might know how much every man had gained by trading.
