We are talking, they say, about what we know, we know this is true. ..Verse 2 quoted. The third verse says, ~~BU~~ "That which we have seen and heard declare we unto you, ..." Christianity is religion of truth. Christianity is religion of faith, yes. But faith does not mean^{and fold it} simply getting ideas/in your head. That is not what faith means. Faith does not mean that it does not matter whether it is true or not. That kind of faith can have tremendous effect upon us. I saw that in my own experience when I was in Seminary. I came to my last year in Seminary, and near that Seminary was a University which had a very, very fine small ^{hospital} house for students which was opened to the students of the Seminary. And I had been there nearly for three years, and never got any use out of that hospital there, that infirmary. One day I thought that I certainly would have to, because I felt that I really had a fever. Oh, I just felt miserable, and I thought I was going to go over there and go to bed in that infirmary, and I got my suitcase and I packed it up and it was about four or five blocks to walk. I went step by step, and every step I had to stop and rest, and finally I got there, and I came there and I said, I've got fever and I'd like to go to bed. Well, the lady said, we certainly would be glad to put you to bed ^{fever, and she said, let us take your} if you have/temperature, and she stuck a thermometer into my ^{mouth,} and after a little
