says, "But speaking the truth in love, may grow up into him in all things, which is the head, even Christ." So our growth in grace is our first purpose; it is that in which the Lord is primarily interested. He says in 1 Pet. 2:2, "as new born babes desire the sincere milk of the word that ye may grow thereby", and in 2 Pet. 3:18, He says, "Grow in grace and in the knowledge of our Lord and Saviour Jesus Christ."

Now in view of this fact in view of this stress in the Scripture, it is easily understandably why in the Middle Ages and shortly before also, many people withdrew themselves completely from the world and tried to go off as hermits or, monks by themselves apart from the # world thinking ## simply to perfect their spiritual life and self to grow in grace. Now that is much better than to devote yours # 1/4 \* to the service of the Lord in spreading of His Word and not to grow at all yourself. But it is a perversion and a misunderstanding, because we cannot truly grow in grace without serving the Lord and having a concern for others. Our service is a vital part of our
