8. Three Experiences With Water

a. Water is a frequent figure in Scripture. You are all familiar with many of the references to water in the NT. And most of don't have to worry about getting access to water. Actually there is nothing more important in our lives than water. I remember hearing a Christian worker tell once about being at a meeting with a group of Christians, and what a surprise he had when the man who was called on to say grace at the fell's beginning of the meal g thanked the Lord for the food and for the water. He was not accustomed to hearing that. And yet water is actually even more important to life than food is. We can live a certain length of time without food, but the time
