I'd like to start this morning with reading the 136th Psalm -- the first 4 verses. (Reading text . . .) This morning at this Thanksgiving season I want to look back a little bit at our history and to see flust why it is that this is a important time for us in America. About 10 years ago one time the Sat. Eve. Post, which was then a magazine that was sold in every town and hamlet in the U.S. came out with a big headline on its cover at about this time of year -- It said, Let's have no more nonsense about the Pilgrims. See page so and so, and then you turned to page so and so in the Post and there was an article written by a man who said that he thought that it was utterly ridiculous that so such attention was paid to the Pilgrims, and so much talk about them at Thanksgiving time.
