

I am going to touch in general on a number of different aspects. I thought perhaps it would be worthwhile to mention a thing that has struck me very definitely, is the difference between the general situation as it is now and as it was when I attended school. When I went to college I went to a very fine Christian college, which a few years before I entered was probably sending more people into the ministry and missionary work than any other college in the country. It was an outstanding Christian witness. But then they gradually got in people who denied the Word, and who did not believe. They started in the scientific department, and then they got into the philosophy and into Bible, and so you had a situation in those days when you had many many institutions which were anywhere from 50 to 150 yrs. old that had been started as very thoroughly Christian institutions and modernism was coming in. You had a direct conflict with it. You faced it directly. Now today we have a very different situation, because most of those institutions have been taken over completely by the modernists and almost anybody that goes to them simply given out straight unbelief today. The people who were students facing it when I was there now their children have been raised in a generally unbelieving atmosphere. And on the other hand during this last half century we have started many Christian colleges and seminaries, and the great bulk of our students come from thoroughly Christian churches or thoroughly Christian colleges and they have not had so much direct confrontation with modernism. We are in the way you might say we have two distinct groups today, whereas we were mixed then as they were taking over the old institutions most of which they have now taken over.
