this time when we enjoy the blessings of the 23rd Psalm with the return of Christ in peece power to put an end to all that is evil and to set up His kingdom of happiness and joy and peace upon this earth. Oh, may God enable each one of us to realize what this 22nd Psalm means, to realize not only the marvelous thing means that God should predict the future in this way and given a 1,000 years in advance something make that would so exactly mearthy means to the experiences of Christ on the cross and the wonderful accomplishment that followed it with the resurrection and the outgoing of salvation through Him. Wonderful the evidence it gives of the authority of God's word, that imm it is indeed His revelation. But I let us try to experience this Psalm, to live, to realize it so that we shall immit indeed be able to say, "I am crucified with Christ, nevertheless, I live, yet not I, but Christ liveth in me." Let us pray.
