dreams, at least as far as predicting the future is concerned. In most cases the content of a dream is simply the result of one's physical and mental condition. Yet God might **xh** choose to get(?) give(?) **XEXER** disclose (?) a revelation through a dream and did so on various occasions before his **xx** written Word was completed. In ancient times superstitious ideas about dreams were very widespread. IN this case God used the superstitious ideas of the day, some of them shared even by the mighty king Nebuchadnezzar, to provide a means for giving knowledge to His people, just as on other **axk** occasions God has chosen to use men's prejudices to accomplish His own purposes! (Cf. John 11:49ff). (Compare John 11:49ff).

Often in interpretation of the Bible it is necessary to learn from its statements or implications of a background a background that has not been fully described, but that is essential to its correct understanding. In this case it seems reasonable to assume such a background, although Daniel has not explicitly stated it. Probably Neb<sup>o</sup> had asked his counsellors on various occasions to interpret drama his dreams and they had.
