then if we are injured, it is all part of His plan and He has wonderful purposes that we may not actually see until we are in heaven, but we will then see and we will glorify Him for it.

So if we have suffering that is not the result of our sin, not the result of our mistakes, it may be part of God's purpose of sanctification for us, and we should rejoice in it. The Chirstian should never be a sorrowful person. We are told to rejoice in all things in everything give thanks because everything that comes into our lives is part of God's purpose for us.

So I think as we see David with a great sorrow, a great disappointment when actually he saw that there was no hope for the child, and that the child was dead, he rose up and ate and went forward and did what God had for him. I think we should also when things go wrong, not blame others. God will take care of it. Vengeance is His. He will take care of it. Unless of course we are place in a position where God enables us to help those others in some. But if its' a matter of getting even with them, or anything like that it is not the for the Christian. But God wants us to know that in all the experiences that come to us He has a purpose we may not see, but it is an important purpose and it may be veryvital for us.

And then "when the child is dead" we should rise and go about our business and step forward to serve Him and accomplish His will.
