

a man can pick up and use. You have no thoughts of your own. You do what you are ordered. It was a great and powerful instrument for destroying Protestantism.

Today, like the Roman Catholic church the Jesuit order is split into many divisions. Some are communists; some are very very strict in their standards of what the Roman Catholic church was 200 years ago; some are extreme modernists; some are almost like Protestants, in their viewpoints.

I talked to a Jesuit one day I happened to run on to. I said, "My we used to think of the Jesuit order as so utterly monolithic. Now they are so divided." He said, "You have to be on the inside to have any idea how divided we are."

There is a situation there were Roman Catholic people do not have this monolithic thing: this is the answer, and so long as we go through the forms everything is alright. They don't have it anymore because their leaders are split and divided. They are hungry for the gospel. It was not more than 30 years ago that almost any Roman Catholic who picked up a Bible, the priest was apt to say that's a sin. You musn't look at it. Today they encourage them to read the Bible, and people are hungry for the Word of God.

God wants us to make our primary activity spreading His Word. Every Christian. Whether he opens our way to give our full time to it or whether we do it on the side. I remember a few years ago a Vice President of the Philadelphia Electric Co. --evidently a very busy and active businessman--who practically every night was speaking in a mission somewhere in Philadelphia.

We used to have a close friend who was a lawyer in New York -- Dr. James E. Bennett. Dr. Bennett was probably preaching more than most ministers do. What a shame for those who are supposed to be giving their whole life to the work of the gospel, that some others accomplish so much.

I talked with a young graduate of seminary(not this seminary) not long ago. I said, "What are you doing?" He said, "I'm still continuing in my secular work that I did while I was in school. He said, "There's a buyers market for teachers in theology." Well, the Lord said, "Go into the highways and byways and compell them to come in. He didn't say, "Sit down and wait for someone to offer you a good salary in order that you should bring them the Word of God."

God wants us to use strategy. He wants us to see how we can advance the message most effectively. There are ways that can be very effective. There are ways that can be made different for different people but every person has a particular way he can be reached. There are particular ways that any of us can be effective and in which others cannot be effective.
