

college students for Christ. We had a graduate some years ago who is now one of our directors, Herman Eckelman. Mr. Eckelman was a graduate of Cornell University. A graduate in engineering. He saw the great need among students. He went there and got a position, first in electronics, then in photography and did full time work for the university. Buthe got a large house in order that there might be room in it to establish a church.

He started doing personal work among students. Over the past 20 years he has had a tremendous influence among outstanding students there. Many who have given years to getting very fine training in many areas of life and they have come to feel that the Lord's service is the most important. They have come to know Him as Saviour.

I wish that similar work to Mr. Eckelman's could be done in every campus in America. I can't think of any need that is more strategic than reaching college students for Christ. Of course, you might not use that sort of technique he did. A person might start a little church in a neighborhood of a university, or he might get a call to a church in the neighborhood of a university, and look for ways of working with college students.

I always like to think of the type of work that it does not merely accomplish the immediate thing,--it does not go on arithmetically, but geometrically. If you can reach one who can then go on to reach others, that I think is the strategy God wants us to use.

Think of Hudson Taylor when he went to China and began opening up Christian work there. He came into a great province where there were 3 or 4 million people. He came to a town and went right through it. He came to a city and went right through. He went on to the capital of the province. There in the capital he started a church and people criticized him for it. They said, Why does Hudson Taylor go past all these other places and go up to the provincial capital when he's passed all these different people, all these other towns?

Hudson Taylor said, If I go into one of these small towns and I get a church started, and then you go into a bigger one and the people say, Where does he come from? Oh from that little town! But he said, If I go up to the capital and get a church under way there, then go to smaller cities and people say, Where is he from? They say, He's from a church up in the capital city and it made it easy to get a hearing.

Paul said he was ready to do every possible thing == means to get a hearing for the gospel. But how many of our Christian workers --workers think it is necessary to get unity on every little point. The Lord certainly wants us to feel the unity of the whole church of Christ. But he does not expect us to agree on every little point. I don't think you could get two intelligent people to agree on anything. They wouldn't be human if they did!
