Ethiopians used spears to fight against Mullelene's tanks
- 3 God's promise to Barak regarding Jabin's army
- 4 Barak's strategy
God said he would lure Sisera to disaster
Deborah says God told her this. Organic prophecy
Barak ready to shift the blame for any failure on to Deborah
- 5 The strategy and how it worked out
- 6 An army in the Middle Ages that decided to follow the same strategy
but was no storm so failed.
- Traveling on horseback in 1929 in the outbacks of Palestine
Information easily gotten
Harder to get information at next Arab town
- Jael's dilemma
Deborah had no idea how God would deliver them--inorganic prophecy
- 7 People only too willing to attributedeliverances to natural causes
Britain's fight with Hitler--English channel. Dunkirk
Rejoiced over their deliverance but boasted in themselves and the RAF and
- 8 forgot God
- Minister's daughter skeptical of prayer. Caught leg in bicycle and broke it.
Questioned whether vacancy in hispital for her could be called an answer
to prayer.
- 9 How prove it was not an accident? Chance?
God's revelation beyond any human cleverness to predict
- Tow other cases of inorganic prophecy:
- 10 Isa. 53:9 grave with wicked
Ps. 22 picture of the crucifixion. Verse 18 "divide my garments,
and cast lots for my clothing"
- Prediction given by Deborah did not happen ~~til~~ hundreds of years later
