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Well, now Mr. Clark was Vice Pres. forf a couple of years.before that I think he did a marvellous job of administration. I feel that when it comes to the inner working of the seminary I think that where we ==that the way we are now is as fine as it' has ever been.

I would like to see it continue that way and I sort of shake everytime I think of bringing in somebody from outside who may be at one with us on 90 important points, 90 points let's say and there may be 2 important points he would differ enough from us to just change our whole outlook. I tremble at the thought of somebody coming completely from the outside.

Then you think of the cost of bringing somebody and the extra cost for taking care of them and all that. I say if we can find a man whom is as much in line with what we want as Dr. Taylor was and a man who has the reputation that he had, why it's worth borrowing a substantial sum ofmoney to bring him here and get him going. But where do you get a man like that?

As a far as our internal workings are concerned and the general oversight of everything, I think Mr. Clark is doing an excellent job of it. So I personally am hoping we'll continue just as we are for a good many years. That's myy hope. But I'm not on the committee myself. Some people think -- I've talked this way to Mr. Clark even before we got Mr. Taylor. Mr. Clark said, Well I don't have advanced degrees. I don't have advanced degrees. It's nice to have a man who you can put a few extra degrees after his name. It looks pretty, but when it comes to running a seminary I don't think it makes that much difference.

I had degrees and it was a tremendous help to us in getting going. But only for . . . (END OF TAPE)
