this as an illustration of the fact that Saul's kingdom would be torn away from him and given "to a neighbour of thine, that is better than thou" (I Sam 15:27-28). After Elisha, on his deathbed, had made Joash shoot "the arrow of the Lord's deliverance, and the arrow of deliverance from Syria," he ordered the king to smite the ground with some arrows. When the king lackadaisically hit the ground three times, Elisha pointed out that the failure of Joash to be more enthusiastic in carrying out God's compared to and would result in his victory over Syria is being only partial (II Kings 13:15-19).

When Jeremiah and Ezekiel were required to deliver a message that would be very unpalatable to their listeners, they made frequent use of symbolic acts in order to arouse the people's curiosity and induce them to listen when otherwise they might have refused to give heed. Thus Jeremiah was directed by the Lord to buy a linen girdle and wear it for a time, without putting it in water. Then he was told to "go to Euphrates, and hide it there in a hole of the rock."
