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one of the most characteristic features of the
activity of the Heb. prophets was a state of
ecstasy that would tend to produce unnatural
visions and ideas, and that their belief that
they were divinely directed was simply the
result of an emotional state. The activity of
the prophets has even been compared to that of
the whirling dervishes of Islam, more than a
thousand years after their time.

The strongest evidence adduced from the Bible for the existence of a state of ecstasy among prophets is found in I Kings 18 in the account of the activities of the prophets of Baal who realized on the name of Baal from morning even until noon, saying, O Baal, hear us...And they hear us...And they hear us...And they and cut themselves after their manner with knives and lancets, till the blood gushed out upon them" (vv.26-28).

It should be noticed that this is not an
account of Heb. prophets at all. The quiet and
dignified attitude of Elijah, the true prophet
of God (cf.vv.30-37) is quite in contrast to the
orgiastic and ecstatic activities attributed to
these prophets of Baal. It is not at all

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
