I have rejected the gap theory as an exegetical impossibility, so where do I go now?

I have purchased Whitcomb's book on The Flood and find many evangelical scientists (A.S.A.) and theologians (E.T.S.) think he has some good material but do not agree with him completely. Would you give me your personal opinion of his material and conclusions and your general feelings for flood geology?
