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Semo was, and a number of versions omit the last 2 words.

Shamgar probably an enemy and not a judge.

Jabin also a problem. He is not mentioned in chap. 5. Mentioned in Joshua

(?) 14 his name could be a good Semitic title though here it is a proper name.

Two accounts of battles in the north. Here conflated in the prose account in chap. 4. In chap 5 only one occurs (in the poetical account, which is older).

Jabin is a good west-Semitic name  
Sisera is not a Semitic name.

15 Habarna proper name of a great Hittite king. Sata applied to many Hittite kings.

Burney goes off on a tangent here saying that Sisera is Hittite, - compared with Shamgar, which he suggests to be Hittite. who is usually very careful.
