In v 6 most scholars agree that the
second 57117' is simply a dittography.

Everyone agrees 57117' should mean
"caravans". But the word as vocalized
means "paths" or "roads".

Prob the word originally had
both meanings, and this form would
mean either. In later Heb. the forms
were specialized, one ^{from} for road, and another ^{from} for
caravan.
