give names of Palestine cities and
their kings. — all
at 2000 B.C.

Pottery of Hyksos period corresponds
in Egypt, Palestine, Syria, north Mesopotamia,
and eastern Anatolia. Not found before 2000 B.C.
Displaced about 1300 by Mycenaean pottery.

Hyksos fortifications —
widely area enclosed, wall of beaten
earth instead of stone, very high.

Shows use of great numbers of
cavalry, which required great area
for training. Swift attack from
horses. Special type of organization
of Yamerlun & Genghis Khan

Sharuhen the main Asiatic
capital of the Hyksos
