sign it, Eusebius, (another Busebius), Afrius himself, and two others, who would not sign it. And Co nstantine said, we will banish these four men, and they have to go into one of the outlying provinces of the empire, they cannot have anything to do with the empire, they must not disturb the Christian church anymore with their teaching.

And the Nicean Council had certain decisions dealing with particular controversies that had arisen, they named the books of the Bible, which they said all were agreed on, we have always believed, we were brought up to believe that these are the books of the Bible, they didn't vote as to whether any was one of the books of the Bible or not, they EXEREX accepted it. They passed this creed, and it seemed asif it would be established.

(question) The important thing is not the exact number who didnt sign it, the important thing is that there was hardly anybody who wouldn't sign it, and yet, ten years later, you had the whole empire practically gone over to it, you see. And as to whether it was four or five or six, or as to whether this decisions was taken in November 5, or November 5, you can find those in books, but I don't try to remember them, because they are not particularly important.

(question) The Council was made up of bishops. Any bishop in the empire was able to come, and there were hundreds of them there. They came, not many of them from the west, that was a long ways even though Constatine paid the expenses of all who could come. Hosius, Bishop of Bordola, in Spain, was the presiding officer of the Council when Constantine was not there, and I believe that the Catholic Encyglopedia, I know it was some Catholic sourse says, Hosius of Bordola presided over the council as the representative of the pope. Theretax There is no evidence in any ancient work that he was in any sense whatever representing the bishop of Rome. The Bishop of Rome was not present. There were two presbyters who came to represent him, I think he was an elderly man at the time, it would have been w quite a trip for him, he didn't come, he hadn't been consulted partex particularly about the founding of it, he didn't have much to do with it. But he had two men there to represent
