I said that I would call this St. Ambrose, but I decided to change the title. I am going to call this St. Ambrose and the fall of paganism. I thought Ambrose was a little small for a title in view of the large subjects that we kex have been covering in the other titles, so you can just lengthen it to St. Ambrose and the fall of Paganism. I think that perhaps will be a reserved reasonable outline title here. It is a little hard to make outlines that are about the same lengths in sections, and covers the material in such a way as to make it as clear aspossible. Then, my number 2, I am going to entitle Gratian and the altar of victory. Gratian and the altar of victory. Gratian is not one of the most important experts by any menses. But he was, his relationship with Ambrose, are of considerable interest. He was only sixteen years of age when he became emperor, in 375. And he reigned for eight years. I am not sure that I can read my notes here, whether it was 379 or 374 that Ambrose became bishop, I wrote the letter practically inbetween a 4 and a 9, so I am not sure which it is.
