

all of that matters, we have the idea widespread in our western nation, that the worst possible evil is war. It is the worst possible evil. The worst possible evil is the loss of people. And certainly justice is more impossible (hard to hear), and certainly the maintenance of a standard is right, and somebody has said, if we make peace the end instead of justice, the time will come when we will have neither peace nor justice. And that certainly is true. And when our nation united with Churchill in making that Atlanta Charter, we said we are going to stand for freedom, the freedom of religion, freedom from fear, and freedom from want. Well, the question may we raised, is freedom from want something that the government can really give. That rests upon the people. The government can make conditions on which they can do that. But the other three certainly are the duty of the government, to do everything it can to make freedom from fear. The government is here to protect us from bandits. That is why we have a government. Freedom of speech. It is the government's duty to see to it, that we can speak out on what we think, as long as it isn't biting to injure us. And freedom of religion. It certainly is the government's place to protect us in our freedom of this. So certainly the first three freedoms, when Churchill and Roosevelt, said we are going to stand for these, they are standing on high noble efforts of ground.

But then when the Germans attacked Russia, immediately they threw all their principles away, and immediately they joined with one who was more against the ~~firm~~ three freedoms, than Germany had ever been. And joining with them, the whole moral basis of the work was cast down. And if they had said, we are standing for these principles, they could have stand we are going to stand for them, and (14) we think it is necessary to do the work that way. But they had no more in moral ground on which to stand and the United Nations was formed, not to maintain justice, and to give people their rights, but to maintain peace, and to include in it, all peace loving nations, and any peace loving nation was any nation that had declared war against Germany. So two or three nations declared war on Germany after the war was over, in order to be permitted to join the U. N.
