People interpreted the Bible in ~~the~~ terms of the world view of their day, and then when we learn to know more about the universe in which we live / the Bible / ~~became~~ out-of-date. Actually, when we examine the Bible closely, we find that it fits with our expanding world-view much more than the smaller world-~~view~~ view that was previously held. ^{Fifth} It is important that we know the grammatico-historical method of interpreting the Word. Let us see exactly what is there. ~~When~~ ~~we~~ ~~ask~~ ~~the~~ ~~questions~~ Let us look at all the questions that occur ~~in~~ to our minds, as we look at any passage of the Scripture. And let us ask, Does the Scripture definitely teach certain things? Does the Scripture definitely deny certain things? ^e Does the Scripture ~~make~~ not make a statement at all in relation to this thing. Let us not build too much upon trying to squeeze any one verse ~~of~~ of the Scripture to the limit. Human words / ~~are~~ are slippery devices. Let us interpret the Scripture by Scripture, and ~~read~~ ^{interpret} the Book as a whole. When we do so, we will find that the Bible is never out-of-date, but is constantly ahead of date. There are probably ~~lots~~ individuals today who are trying to make the interpretations / of the world ~~in~~ that will rule ~~God~~ ^{God} out of the universe. However, no widely accepted cosmogony of today will really do this. Genesis 1:1 can fit with any of the widely held cosmogony of today.
