been a constant and frequent repetition of<sup>a</sup>/certain processes, a process which we find  
given in Greek in Matthew 16. In Matthew 16 we read that Jesus asked the disciples

who they thought He was. And we find in Matthew 16:13 that He asked them, "Who do

men say that I, the Son of Man, am?" And they answered, "Some say that thou art John

the Baptist; some Elijah; and others, Jeremiah, or one of the prophets." He saith

unto them, "But who say ye that I am?" And Simon Peter answered and said, "Thou art

the Christ, the Son of the living God." Here was the declaration of

Peter understood. And Jesus answered and said to him, "Blessed art thou, Simon

Bar-Jonah; for flesh and blood hath not revealed it unto thee, but my Father who is

in Heaven. And I say unto thee, that thou art Peter, and upon this rock I will

build my church; and the gates of Hell shall not prevail against it."
