

country had by that time turned away from belief in the Bible as the Word of God, dependable and free from error, and were teaching destructive criticism, were teaching theories that are contrary to what the Bible teaches, or denying the necessity for belief in Christ for salvation. And so Princeton Seminary was the last of the great old seminaries in the United States that were standing strongly for the Word of God, had for many years, it was the last of those great institutions, ^{perhaps} or/about the last, to be won by the forces of unbelief. And through the last century it was the history that one after another was taken over by unbelief. And when they were, it was the institution that was taken over last that always did the most harm. Because people would say I know that this institution is thoroughly sound, now this one is gone, but this one is thoroughly sound, therefore they would go to this one, and that is why they had the large number of students, and then when this one became thoroughly known as modernistic, some other one would be the one that people still had confidence in, and it was always the last one that had the greatest influence for Satan and did the most to destroy people's faith. And that is a wonderful illustration of the fact that God wants His people to be alert and (8 1/4) because Satan can so easily use that which has a firm, established reputation, for if he can change it ~~to~~ to the opposite of what it claims to be, he can use it much more easily than something that everybody knows holds another viewpoint and another position. But I'm not speaking now so much about how Princeton Seminary went, the evidence for that is very complete, I think that if any of you were to go to Princeton for even two or three days now, you couldn't help but see clearly how utterly they have changed from the Princeton Seminary that I went to in 1924. I am not merely speaking about that change but about how in many points we are carrying on at Faith the tradition that Princeton Seminary carried on for over a century before the forces of Modernism took it over. There are a few points at which we have made
