of external peace and safety, when Satan is bound to deceive the nations no more, and after many days, He is released for a little season. Now in chapter 26, we have another picture. And in chapter 26, the chapter begins, in fact in 25 and 26, there, in the first part of 26, there is a good deal of praise to God and recognition of His goodness in the midst of difficulty, but we have another series of statements here, that show a progress of events in a very striking way in chapter 26. I'm not going to take a great deal of time in this class on this subject, so it is just a question of where we want to start our details and considerations of chapter 26. The beginning of it has some beautiful statements. Look at verse 3. Thou wilt keep him in perfect peace, whose mind is stayed on thee; because He trusted in thee. Trust ye in the Lord forever, for in the Lord Jehovah is everlasting strength. The Lord, in the midst of exile and in the midst of difficulty and in the midst of oppression, (9 1/2) giving us peace in the heart, as we trust in Him. But now let's look into verse 12 and see what we can see of specific application from verse 12 on. Verse 12, Lord, thou wilt ordain peace for us; for thou also hast wrought all our works in us. What a picture of salvation by faith. What a picture of God's Holy Spirit, working in us. He has wrought all our works in us. He will
