And he was intellectually dishonest~~y~~ on what he said, but if it was intentionally so, I don't know, but it (10). is ~~wonderful~~ in one sphere

And the greatest thinkers whose work (10) make the silliest mistakes in other spheres. The man who today is the president of the great general dynamics corporation was secretary of the army in Washington when I attended the conference on the chaplaincy, in Washington, religious leaders ~~groups~~ from all over the country. They had the secretary of the army, and of the air force, and generals and admirals as representatives, and this man addressed the secretary of the army, he told how his little girl had asked him about a little problem in arithmetic, she had been working on, and the next night she came home, and she said, you know, the teacher told me what you gave me was wrong. He is president of the great corporations of the United States, today, was head of our whole army, and was probably very excellent in that, daughter but his mind slipped a little cog when he was helping his ~~problem~~ in a little arithmetic problem. And those things happen. And when I hear that 98% of all the great scholars of the world, all of the finest believe in evolution, I say out of those who believe in evolution, 98% of them have never done any research whatever. They have simply taken over what some one had said. And the humblest (11 1/2) of them may make a discovery of tremendous importance on the matter, but the greatest of them is of no importance whatever in the matter, if he is simply receiving what others had said.
