Joel 3 multitudes in the valley of decision
Take advantage of summer ministries
Learn to serve the Lord effectively
Decision should have been easy for Adam and Eve
In choosing between two possibilities
While will most honor the Lord
 - 2 Even listened to wrong advisor
AAM went to Princeton Seminary because it stood against modernism
 - 3 Found students who had come for less worthy reasons
Bad influence on his roommate, changed from being enthused
about the seminary to sneering at godly professors
- Obligation not to be influenced by those who would lead astray
Pick the right advisors. Test those who would mislead
- 4 Eve failed to put God first
Man whose heart was devoted to serve the Lord but was diverted
from it by minor considerations on which he had disappointments
and disagreements. Became engineer in the air force.
- Eve failed to get her facts straight
In going to extremes one develops a reaction to the opposite
Not to touch it. Did not need to be so exact
- Student who after graduating received call from a church
but decided he did not want it. Church disappointed and
would take most anybody. Another student applied and was
voted on, but said he would not come as candidate until
they first had opportunity to get to know him.

go east or west if removed one way or the other on that
