

"Fulfilled and Unfulfilled Prophecy," Carl F. H. Henry on "Jesus Christ and the Last Days," Wilbur M. Smith on "Signs of the Second Advent of Christ," Arnold T. Olson on "The Second Coming of Christ," Charles L. Feinberg on "The Rebuilding of the Temple," and John Walvoord on "The Future of Israel." Yet nearly all of these messages are somewhat modified from the usual type of prophetic message by the general nature of the conference as a whole.

There is not a great deal of Bible interpretation or exegesis in the volume. Exceptions would include Wood's exegesis of Ephesians 1, Clowney's discussion of the way that certain prophecies of the temple are fulfilled in the church, Feinberg's clear presentation of his reasons for believing that Ezekiel 40-48 is to be understood literally and that the temple there described will yet be built, and Walvoord's interpretation of certain details of God's promises to Abraham.

In the book as a whole there is comparatively little direct clash of ideas, though in one case a difference of opinion is indicated by the titles, with Herman N. Ridderbos' message labeled as "The Future of Israel (View I)," and John Walvoord's listed as "The Future of Israel (View II)."
