over our children. We do not believe that ~~this~~ saves the children, or that anyone is saved by any ~~per-~~ particular rite or ceremony. We simply indicate by this ~~our-believe-~~ belief that God has given us these ~~children~~ children and that He will take care of them ~~x~~ if we follow ~~Him~~ Him, and rest in the Lord as we should.

There is thus really no ~~contradiction-contradiction-or~~ point of contradiction between a true understanding of ~~x~~ the dispensationalism of the Scofield Bible and the ~~Cove--~~ teaching of the Bible of the Covenant relation in which the Christian stands to ~~His~~ his God. It is ~~for~~ unfortunate that some ~~people--~~ people carry either one or other of these points to such an ~~exte--~~ extreme that ~~it~~ it becomes a ~~perff--~~ perversion of scriptural teaching ~~and~~ and thus brings discredit on the whole idea. I have heard people speak most scathingly about dispensationalism ~~ah-~~ and have heard others speak scathingly about covenant theology and have found that in most cases the people who spoke this way did not have a real understanding ~~with~~ what either of these ~~the~~ terms properly should mean.

I hope that you will find ~~that~~ this explanation ~~helps~~ helps our position which we believe to be the true teaching of the Bible to ~~be~~ be helpful in ~~clarf- cal-~~ clarifying ~~nk~~ your understanding these matters.
