Well, I believe that a text with~~h~~out a context is on~~ly~~ a pretext and a great part of the error that people come into ~~is~~-, in the study of the scripture or in the study of any other book is taking things out of context. And so just for a second I will call your attention to the fact that after Paul in chapters 1-8 of Romans gives that marvelous presentation of ~~theneee~~-- the need of salvation from sin, justification by faith, and the results of it in the lives of those who are saved. Then he brings that to a ~~grat~~ great climax at the end of chapter 8, and in chapters 9-11 he devotes himself to a problem which seems to have bothered him a great deal. I don't ~~hina~~-- think we need to say seems. It definitely bothers him a great deal or he would not have listed Romans 9:1-~~is~~ 3. I say ~~that~~,- the truth in Christ, I lie not, my conscience also bearing me witness in the Holy Ghost, That I have great heaviness and continual sorrow in my heart. For I could wish that myself were accursed from Christ for ~~m~~ brethren, my kinsmen according to the flesh; ~~Who are Israelites, to whom pertaine~~ It is very clear that Paul was ~~tremdn~~ tremendously burdened, ~~so that~~ though he was an apostle to the Gentiles, he was tremendously burdened with the fact that ~~be~~ the Gentiles who are now coming into the knowledge of Christ were becoming a far greater section
